Boston Children's Hospital

Boston Children's Hospital, the primary pediatric teaching affiliate of Harvard Medical School, is home to the world's largest research enterprise based at a pediatric medical center. Its discoveries have benefited both children and adults since 1869. Today, more than 2,630 scientists, including nine members of the National Academy of Sciences, 14 members of the National Academy of Medicine and 11 Howard Hughes Medical Investigators comprise Boston Children's research community. Founded as a 20-bed hospital for children, Boston Children's is now a 415-bed comprehensive center for pediatric and adolescent health care.





Teach For America

Teach For America works in partnership with urban and rural communities in 51 regions across the country to expand educational opportunity for children. Founded in 1990, Teach For America recruits and develops a diverse corps of outstanding leaders to make an initial two-year commitment to teach in highneed schools and become lifelong leaders in the effort to end educational inequity. Today Teach For America is a force of 60,000 alumni and corps members committed to profound systemic change. From classrooms to districts to state houses across America, they're reimagining education to realize the day when every child has an equal opportunity to learn, to grow, to influence and to lead. Teach For America is a proud member of the AmeriCorps national service network.

United Way of Webster Dudley

For 52 years, United Way of Webster and Dudley has made the commitment to improve the lives of people in the local community. They continue this commitment with help from 17 partnering agencies that work with our local residents to maintain a strong family, healthy lifestyle and a positive outlook for the future of our children.





Nuestros Pequeños Hermanos (NPH)

NPH's Seattle Institute offers promising young adults a deep and advanced leadership formation experience in the U.S. Each year six university-aged students from NPH are selected to spend ten months in Seattle, enrolling in a full-time English program and participating in a comprehensive leadership development program. The goal of the program is to train talented youth to maximize their own potential and to serve others in their local communities.

Worcester Community Action Council (WCAC)

Since 1965, the Worcester Community Action Council has served as the federally designated anti-poverty agency for central and southern Worcester County, with a mission of helping people move to economic self-sufficiency through programs, partnerships and advocacy. WCAC's Head Start program serves families from the communities of East Brookfield, Leicester, Millbury, Oxford, Spencer, Southbridge and Webster. Families must meet income eligibility standards to qualify. Children in foster care, homeless children, and children from families receiving public assistance (Temporary Assistance for Needy Families or Supplemental Security Income) are also eligible for Head Start services regardless of income.





FUNDACIÓN MAPFRE PARTNERS WITH TEACH FOR AMERICA TO WELCOME EXCEL ACADEMY STUDENTS FOR CAREER DAY

Through a partnership with Teach For America–Massachusetts, Fundación MAPFRE welcomed students from Excel Academy East Boston's eighth grade honor society to their North American headquarters for a career day at MAPFRE USA. Students were greeted by Alfredo Castelo, President & CEO of MAPFRE USA, representing Fundación MAPFRE in the U.S., and other MAPFRE leaders. "It is a privilege to spend time with the exceptional students from Excel Academy," said Mr. Castelo. "We are thrilled to have the opportunity to impact the lives of these fine young men and women by sharing our business experiences and immersing them in MAPFRE USA's corporate culture with this on-site day of learning."

This visit was part of a year-long collaboration, which has included a \$75,000 investment by Fundación MAPFRE in Teach For America-Massachusetts to deepen the support that the organization offers its teachers and school leaders at Excel Academy East Boston. At the beginning of the school year, MAPFRE USA employees also donated school supplies to Excel Academy's students and classrooms. "Teach For America corps members and alumni are one third of our faculty," said Excel Academy East Boston's Head of School and Teach For America alumnus, Jennifer Gallaspy. "These are leaders who understand the value of innovation in education and believe deeply in all children. We are fortunate to work with Fundación MAPFRE and Teach For America partnership on two different occasions this year and are excited to see the impact of this leadership trip on our students."

By partnering with Teach For America–Massachusetts, Fundación MAPFRE is creating community impact through improved access to high-quality education for students, and customized local engagement aligned to the needs of Excel East Boston.

"Today in America, the circumstances of children's births predict the opportunities they have in life. Children growing up in historically marginalized and disenfranchised communities lack access to a broad spectrum of resources and opportunities," said Teach For America–Massachusetts Executive Director, Josh Biber.

Currently in their ninth year of partnership with Massachusetts public schools, Teach For America-Massachusetts has a network of over 2,200 alumni and corps members across the state who have made a lifelong commitment to ending inequity in education.

TEACH FOR AMERICA AND FUNDACIÓN MAPFRE TOGETHER ON THE WEST COAST

Fundación MAPFRE's partnership with Teach For America (TFA) has allowed MAPFRE Insurance employees to support schools in California, Massachusetts and Ohio through volunteer activities and drives. The partnership also provides support to TFA teachers and leaders including:

- One-on-one teaching observation and debrief sessions
- Mentoring of teachers
- Targeted workshops and skill-building sessions
- · Cohort and subject-based learning communications
- Community-building activities

On May 7, 2018, volunteers from MAPFRE USA's San Ramon, CA office visited the Frick Impact Academy in Oakland, CA for an educational day of learning. Volunteers were paired with students for a game that demonstrated the importance of insurance and were presented with books donated by MAPFRE employees. The donation helped complete the academy's library and provided additional books for classrooms. MAPFRE employees were thrilled to be a part of this unique volunteer program and happy to connect with students to promote life-long learning.

This was the first Bay Area event in Fundación MAPFRE's partnership with TFA. In support of the Deep Partnership project, TFA received funding of 50,000 euros (\$59,600 USD) from the Fundación in 2018.

FUNDACIÓN MAPFRE FUNDS GRANT TO WORCESTER COMMUNITY ACTION COUNCIL NUTRITION PROGRAM

In 2018, Worcester Community Action Council (WCAC) received a \$57,000 grant from Fundación MAPFRE to support nutrition initiatives at the agency's Head Start program.

Healthy nutrition is crucial for a child's immediate success and provides a solid foundation for healthy growth and development throughout the course of their lifetime. Children enrolled in WCAC's Head Start program receive a nutritional breakfast, lunch and snack each day to help promote a healthy lifestyle.


The United States Department of Agriculture (USDA) reimburses a portion of the cost to provide healthy food to students, but the initiative is not fully funded. The grant provided by Fundación MAPFRE will provide each of the 203 children enrolled in the program the equivalent of 89 daily breakfasts.

Children enjoy their meals served family-style so teachers and staff can model table manners, sharing and social interaction lessons.

"Early childhood learning programs are important to the development of our children," said Alfredo Castelo, Fundación MAPFRE representative in the U.S. "Fundación MAPFRE is proud to support Head Start and help children in our local communities begin their day with a healthy meal."

Team members from MAPFRE toured WCAC's Head Start program in August 2018 to and read stories in classrooms before joining the youngsters for lunch.

FUNDACIÓN MAPFRE PARTNERS WITH BOSTON CHILDREN'S HOSPITAL TO RAISE AWARENESS FOR ACCIDENT PREVENTION AND SAFETY

More than 29 million children under 15 are treated for some kind of accidental injury in ERs (Emergency Rooms) every year across the United States. Over 4,000 die from their injuries, with the majority stemming from road accidents. In Massachusetts, on the eastern coast of the United States, road accidents take 20 young lives every year. We sit down with the Director of the Trauma Center at Boston Children's Hospital, one of the most innovative and renowned medical centers in the country, where Fundación MAPFRE is developing an awareness-raising program on the importance of accent prevention and road safety.

Not only the teaching hospital of Harvard University, it is also one of the country's leading pediatric hospitals, receiving the most serious and complex cases, those for which no solution can be found anywhere else in the world. And this is a source of pride for David Mooney (Missouri, 1973), who for the last 20 years has been treating the injuries of patients who arrive at the hospital, many of them the result of falls, one of the most frequent accidents among young Americans, as well as road accidents. He is the first to acknowledge that there is much to be done. Half of the children who die on U.S. roadways are not properly restrained in mandatory child seats.

MAPFRE AND BOSTON CHILDREN'S HOSPITAL TEAM UP TO HELP LOCAL FRIENDLY HOUSE SHELTER

On March 3, 2018, MAPFRE volunteers worked with Boston Children's Hospital at Friendly House, a family shelter in Worcester, MA. Volunteers were tasked with "childproofing" the shelter to prevent potential injuries. Residents welcomed the group who worked to protect from possible falls, bumps and electrical accidents. The day was spent installing children's safety bed rails, outlet covers, cabinet locks and more. Volunteers also walked throughout common areas and bathrooms securing heavy furniture with safety straps, covering outlets with safety plugs, installing toilet seat locks and stocking bathtub thermometers to identify when bath water reaches a safe temperature.






MAPFRE HUMAN RESOURCES AND THE PAJAMA PROGRAM







GREAT STRIDES CYSTIC FIBROSIS WALK, PUTNAM CONNECTICUT

Over 100 MAPFRE volunteers, family members and friends gathered in Putnam, CT on September 15, 2018, to support their fellow colleagues and the continued search for a Cystic Fibrosis cure. MAPFRE's walking team was led by Kayla Costa, employee and volunteer committee member, whose boyfriend suffers from Cystic Fibrosis. The team came out in such a large number that they were presented with the "Team that Came Out in Force" award by the Cystic Fibrosis organization.

CF is a rare, genetic, life-threatening disease that makes it difficult to breathe. 30,000 people in the US are affected, and there are approximately 1,000 new cases every year. There is no cure at this time.

"There are approximately 30,000 Americans living with Cystic Fibrosis. They are moms, dads, sisters, brothers, daughters, sons, friends, and co-workers who struggle every day just to breathe. My boyfriend Mark is one of these brave people. He has lived with this terrible disease for 29 years. Mark has one of the most amazing attitudes even though he lives with CF. He's given me a new perspective on what is truly important in life. His attitude, along with all the great research, breakthroughs and hard work put in by the Cystic Fibrosis Foundation as well as families, friends, coworkers, volunteers, etc. of people living with this disease has truly inspired me to start doing my part. 
GIVING BACK TO THE COMMUNITY: SUMMER INTERNSHIP DAY OF CARING
